NFCAplus© - THE 4 C's FOR SUCCESS IN YOUR BOOK PROGRAM

CONNECT – Connect with your assigned NFC Academy Resource Assistant as you begin your journey. Your Resource Assistant is there to provide answers and resources that will aid you and assure you to reach your goals with maximum success.

COMPLETE – Your Welcome Letter from the Academy office gives you your academic school year so you can complete all required work within the 180-day school year. As you follow your NFC Academy Daily Lesson Planner for each subject, you are assured you are meeting the goals for completion. Your school year has all observed holidays calculated so you can have confidence you are completing the journey on time.

CONFIRM – As you are completing the journey, remember to confirm the daily work as you enter all grades in your Ignitia Teacher Gradebook. Ignitia will average grades as you enter, so you are seeing the current average every time you enter grades. Entering grades at the end of every school week will provide important visual feedback on the accomplishments in your homeschool educational activities. You will also be confirming to NFC Academy, your homeschool accredited partner, that regular attendance is being followed.

CERTIFY – As we work together in this exciting journey of education, you will complete the final steps in the journey by providing to the Academy the necessary work products so the Academy, as an accredited school, can finalize and complete the formal grading reports each semester. As these are provided, the parents are certifying that these are the work of their homeschool student. When you have all grades entered in your Teacher Portal and work products submitted (LIFEPAC Unit Tests), your Resource Assistant will complete the academic report cards. Final report cards will be sent to the home for your records and recognition of your child's completion of all work each semester and at the end of the year notice of being promoted to the next grade for the next school year.

NFC ACADEMY PARENTS AND STUDENTS

NFC ACADEMY PARENT STUDENT AGREEMENT

The school, the parent, and the student are partners in most any educational setting. The best chance for all to be successful is an understanding of our goals and responsibilities in this important endeavor. It is necessary upon enrollment that parents and students agree to the information in this parent agreement.

NFC ACADEMY

•It is our goal to support and encourage our parents and students by:

•NFC Academy's curriculum is written from a Bible-centered, Christian worldview in accordance with the Academy's Statement of Faith.

•NFC Academy will use a variety of educationally sound tools that will properly place students at their current level of academic achievement. Those tools include previous school records, assessment tests that may be available at NFC Academy when needed, and discussions with parents.

•NFC Academy will provide a comprehensive program of study from Kindergarten through High School which can lead to graduation from NFC Academy.

•NFC Academy will provide the parents with assistance in the academic, administrative, and technological areas including technical support.

•NFC Academy will provide qualified teachers in the Online Teacher program who will provide instruction, answer questions, provide grading, recording, and the reporting of student progression on a regular basis. Reports will include scheduled report cards and transcripts needed for college admissions and work-related inquiries.

•NFC Academy will provide to those in Kindergarten and the 1st – 2nd grade book program and the Home Teacher Online Program (grades 3-12 online) for those being the primary teacher at home an NFC Academy Resource Assistant to answer general questions throughout the year and complete the required report cards.

•NFC Academy is accredited by Cognia (formerly AdvancEd/SACS), the Middle States Commission on Elementary and Secondary Education and the Florida Association of Christian Colleges & Schools.

•NFC Academy's high school core courses have been approved by the NCAA to meet initial academic eligibility for student athletes.

•NFC Academy will provide the daily lesson plans and regular updates to lesson plans that will guide the parent and student through until completion of the course of study each semester.

•NFC Academy admits students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded or made available at the school and the school does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national and ethnic origin the administration of its educational policies, admission policies, scholarships, and loan programs and athletic and other school administered programs.

•The NFC Academy Daily Lesson Planner is provided to families in K-4th grade book program and is your tool to stay on schedule with the work, so you finish at your scheduled end time.

•The online learning program will provide students with their daily work requirements working with their teacher(s), so they meet their scheduled end date of school.

NFC ACADEMY PARENTS

•As a parent, I will review and abide by all policies and procedures in the Academy's Parent Handbooks and expressed on the Academy's website and in the NFC Academy digital email.

•I understand that it is my responsibility to meet all applicable local and state educational laws and requirements. NFC Academy is a registered private school with the Department of Education in the state of Florida and meets statutory requirements for a private school in the state of Florida. Any additional courses required by another state in a student's courses of study is the responsibility of the home parent to notify NFC Academy as a part of the Path to Graduation or Academic Plan that is issued to each full-time student each year.

•I understand I am responsible for providing onsite supervision for my student and motivating my student to follow and complete each assigned course of study with the designated enrollment period. I understand the Ignitia Parent Portal is a key to effectively monitor my student's work and will use it actively in doing so. Checking should include due date of each daily assignment, its completion date, and final grade. If completion dates are not consistent with due dates that will tell the parent that the student is likely getting off their schedule for completion of their work and steps should be taken to have the student caught up in their work.

•For those families in Kindergarten and 1st – 2nd grade it is important to keep your Resource Support Assistant updated regularly with the progress being made as it relates to your NFC Academy Daily Lesson Planner. We will work with you to help you stay close to your schedule.

•I understand that the academic year is 180 school days, and that the Academy allows 10 months to complete a full year of course work. If my child needs additional time to complete the schoolwork, then I may request an extension of time to complete the work. Parents must request in writing an extension for course work and the decision is at the discretion of the Academy following the policy of no more than one calendar year to complete all course work.

- I may request a one-month extension with no additional charge in tuition.
- A second extension request may be made for one additional month and an additional tuition charge will be made at the regular monthly tuition amount for that grade in the online program.
- There are no additional tuition charges for extensions for students in the K-2nd grade book program or the online Home Teacher Programs grades 3-12.
- Students in all of the accredited programs must complete their course work within the 180 days of the standard school year and up to extensions of two months not to exceed a total of a calendar year.

•I understand it is my responsibility to pay all tuition and fees as set by the Academy depending upon the tuition option I have selected---annually, semi-annually, or monthly.

•I understand that the registration fee is non-refundable once it has been processed, regardless of placement tests or other considerations. Lab fees for Smart Science Labs are non-refundable. The Middlebury Language fees for Elementary and Middle School Spanish are non-refundable as well.

•I have or will read the Tuition Policies on the NFC Academy website under Admissions.

•I am aware that the Academy may change policies and procedures as needed. These changes may appear in the Academy digital email or an updated handbook on the Academy's website typically done twice a year.

•I agree to update the Academy with current contact information, including email, postal and shipping addresses, and telephone numbers. And I recognize email and the CONTACT form on the website are the preferred means of communication between the Academy and the home.

•The NFC Academy digital newsletter is a primary means of communicating general and specific information including policy changes and updates to NFC Academy families and friends. By enrolling my student in NFC Academy, I grant the Academy permission to send me the Academy digital newsletter and other emails and will remain subscribed to such correspondence as long as one or more of my children are enrolled in the Academy.

•From time-to-time NFC Academy uses parent and student testimonials in its communication and advertising. I give permission to NFC Academy to use testimonials I have provided along with any photographs of my child(ren) that I have provided for use.

These testimonials may have included academic achievements at the Academy and/or other notable accomplishments of my children in activities unrelated to NFC Academy. I understand it is the decision of NFC Academy whether to use any information submitted by parents.

The Academy exists to assist parents in fulfilling God's ultimate purpose of preparing children to enter into and mature within His spiritual family, and to respond to Him with respect and obedience. The school seeks to assist in the personal growth and development of students by providing an education based upon an integrated understanding of biblical principles and academic knowledge. Education with a proper emphasis on the spiritual, mental, social, and physical aspects of life will lead to the balanced development of the whole person. THE WHAT AND HOW OF WHAT WE DO!

NFC Academy provides educational programs both to prepare students for entering college to continue their education and to prepare students to enter careers of service in the will of God. These programs seek to transmit and expand knowledge as well as to provide opportunities for research and service. The school will provide the kind of atmosphere which will promote the spiritual, intellectual, social and character development of students. With a clear commitment to academic integrity and excellence, the school will fulfill its mission through the following objectives:

- 1. To provide instruction by a competent Christian faculty committed to a quality academic program.
- 2. To provide students with an atmosphere which is wholesome, stimulating, and conducive to learning and to serving within the Christian concept.
- 3. To provide a balanced emphasis regarding theological beliefs, daily life and conduct, and educational philosophy and practice.
- 4. To effectively train young men and women to be servants of Christ in the church and in the world.
- 5. To provide students with a solid academic and biblical program that will help them to be leaders in areas of their own choice.
- 6. To use an approach to education which addresses the changing technological nature of our society.
- 7. To acquaint students with methods of research in order to develop habits of study for a life of intellectual pursuit.
- 8. To motivate students to think and communicate clearly, objectively, and creatively.

HOW WE SEE LIFE!

Our curriculum is rooted in a God-centered view of life, allowing students the opportunity to understand themselves and the world around them from a biblical worldview. All truth is found in God. It is found in His creation. Scripture is the basis for faith and practice. The integration of biblical faith and learning is our goal at NFC Academy working with each student.

At NFC Academy, we understand our mission is to teach our students to live wholesome Christian lives in a world that many times is in opposition to a biblical worldview. Further, we communicate to our students that they are created in God's image and blessed with distinctive and individual personalities, endowed with special talents for a special purpose.

ACCREDITATION AND MEMBERSHIPS

NFC Academy is registered with the State of Florida Department of Education as a private school serving homeschool families locally, in the United States and around the world. NFC Academy is fully accredited by Cognia (formerly AdvancED/SACS), the Middle States Commission on Colleges and Schools, and the Florida Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (FACCS) which is a member of the National Council for Private School Accreditation. NFC Academy is a member of the Aurora Institute (Formally INACOL).

BIBLE

Bible study is recognized at NFC Academy as of fundamental importance and is a required subject. The study of the Bible augments the study of English, history, geography, and science as well as the other academic subjects.

Without the knowledge of biblical truth, a student cannot be considered educated. The Bible gives direction for this life and is the only hope for the life to come. No other book can enrich the minds and hearts of men as "The Book of books."

Knowledge of the Bible is one of the greatest educational assets any man can have. Resulting from its study are the important values of morality and right living. Character development is the most important work of a school. No other course offered in the school affords such great opportunities for laying the foundation for Christian character as the Bible course. Knowledge is important, but of more importance is the life that displays what has been learned.

STATEMENT OF MORALITY

We believe that God commands that no intimate sexual activity be engaged in outside of a marriage between a man and a woman. We believe that any form of sexual perversion including but not limited to homosexuality, lesbianism, bisexuality, adultery, and pornography are perversions of God's will regarding sexual intimacy. According to the Bible, God made us the gender He chose and attempts to alter one's gender is deviant from His will. (Gen. 2:24; Gen. 19:5, 13, Gen. 26:8-9; Lev. 18:1-30; Rom. 1:26-29; I Cor. 5:1; 6:9, I Thess. 4:1-8; Heb.13:4) We believe that the only legitimate marriage is the joining of one man and one woman. (Gen 2:24; Rom. 7:2; I Cor. 7:10; Eph. 5:22-23) Anyone involved in the promoting of such lifestyles as described above is out of harmony with God's design, the standards set forth for NFC Academy.

GENERAL INFORMATION

CALLING THE ACADEMY – AUTOMATED ANSWERING

NFC Academy has an automated answering service that will permit you to go directly to the department you are calling, or you may dial the direct number to an office as noted. When you call the Academy and the automated attendant answers, you may immediately dial in the extension of the office you are calling, and your call will be transferred to that department. If you do not know the extension of the office you need, the attendant will give you selections to make that will forward your call to the correct office.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS AND PHONE NUMBER

Parents should notify the Academy immediately of any change of address, email, or telephone number (home or business). Email is the primary method of communication, and the Internet is necessary to access on-line complete records through RenWeb. It is important that we have this information, so parents have timely access to the educational program and the administrative software that allows access to their accounting information, make payments, and to view completed semester grades and transcripts.

CHANGE OF INFORMATION

When the parent/guardian has the need to make a change in the students' information, we suggest it is best to go to the NFC Academy web site to make these changes through RenWeb or notify the Academy office.

EXCEPTIONS

On occasion exceptions to a policy may be made when circumstance(s) warrant it in the view of the administration. An exception made for one on any policy is not an exception for any other on that policy or any other policy. All decisions regarding policies are made by the administration and are final.

GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

NFC Academy retains the right to make changes, amendments, and corrections to the rules and policies of the Academy at any time, with or without prior notice. While NFC Academy is not a campus school, parents and students should take careful note of the expectations of behavior for Academy students which would be consistent with the Academy's Mission, Educational Objectives, and Statement of Faith. Students whose

behavior does not meet the expectations in the sole judgment of the administration may be asked to withdraw from NFC Academy.

NON-DISCRIMINATION STATEMENT

NFC Academy admits students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate based on race, color, national and ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, scholarship and loan programs, and athletic and other school-administered programs.

PARENTS WEB/PARENT PORTAL

RenWeb is our web-based program which places all of our school administrative functions in one software package. Parents Web is a private, secure site that allows parents to see detailed information specific to their child. Once enrolled in NFC Academy, parents will be given the necessary instructions and password needed to set-up their own RenWeb account. This parent access is different from your Ignitia Parent Portal if you have a student in the online program.

RECORDS

All school records for students are under the control of the school administration. Student's records are available for inspection by the legal parent/guardian. Student's school records are not available to a third party without the written authorization of both the student's legal parent/guardian and the administration of NFC Academy.

STATE REQUIREMENTS

Each state enacts its own legislation which covers elementary and secondary education. Some states may recognize distance education as "home schooling," while others may classify it differently. It is the responsibility of each parent to comply with any state requirements for enrollment in NFC Academy. NFC Academy is an accredited private school serving homeschool families throughout the United States and around the world. As an accredited school we set-up each student's academic year to meet a typical 180-day school year/90-day semester to meet compulsory attendance requirements that your state may have. Students who are not active in their course work for a period of 30 days may be listed as "inactive" meaning NFC Academy will not be able to confirm the student is meeting the compulsory attendance requirements.

SUPERVISION

Upon enrollment, there must be a home supervisor for the student(s). The home supervisor is typically the parent. On some occasions, the at home teacher may be someone different than the parent, although selected by the parents. It is recommended that parents check any state requirements for the selection. Unless notified differently NFC Academy will accept those listed on the application as the home supervisor.

TEACHER CERTIFICATION

Teachers at NFC Academy hold degrees in their subject areas and are professionally certified teachers by the Florida Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (FACCS/IACCS), or another certifying body, or hold the proper educational credentials to teach the assigned subjects. The teacher along with the homeschool-based parent/teacher has the responsibility for the academic progression of each student in the Homeschool Advantage Program. While NFC Academy teachers in the Homeschool Advantage Program work to ensure academic progress, the parents in the home have a necessary part to ensure students work daily and are completing assigned lessons each day as due.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

SCHOOL YEAR EXTENSION POLICY

The maximum amount of time to complete a school year of study is one calendar year when approved. For an extension in our K-2nd Grade Book Program and Home Teacher Program for 3rd-12th there is no additional charge for an extension of the school year. For those in our Online Teacher Program grades 3rd-12th where NFC Academy teachers are the primary teacher there is no additional charge for a one-month extension. An extension into the final month (12th month/2nd extension) is an additional tuition charge based on the monthly tuition amount. Parents should request an extension with the Academic Office that corresponds with the students grade level.

FINANCIAL POLICY

If you find that in a month you will need extra time for a tuition payment, contact the NFC Academy Business Office for an Exception Application. After the Exception Application is submitted to the Business Office, the financial committee will review the request and notify you of their decision.

REFUND/WITHDRAWAL POLICY

Need to withdraw from your courses? Our hope is that you will stay with us, but if that is your decision, we will work to make your withdrawal as easy as possible. For those families in the Book Program a full semester tuition is owed once books are shipped. There is no withdrawal fee when leaving at the end of a semester if the next semester's books have not been shipped. To initiate the withdrawal process, we must have a request in writing from the parent or guardian.

RETURNED CHECKS

A returned check charge will be incurred each time a check is returned due to insufficient funds. A \$25.00 fee will be charged for all returned checks.

STARTING CLASSES

For billing purposes, students officially start classes on the 1st or the 15th of the month. If student enrollment occurs and students begin class work between the 1st and 14th of the month, the first billing occurs that month. If the student starts classes on the 15th or after, the billing begins the 1st of the next month.

TUITION COST

Please visit the NFC Academy website for a complete review of our tuition and other costs.

TUITION PAYMENTS

Tuition payments are due before the start date of classes at NFC Academy. Tuition payments can be made by clicking on the link provided in the email that will be sent to the parent/guardian during the enrollment process.

All tuition accounts are maintained within the RenWeb software system accessible to parents online 24/7. Tuition accounts are billed from the 1st of each month and late after the 10th of the month due. A late fee of \$25 is charged when the account is not paid by the 10th of the month due.

ACADEMIC POLICIES

TEACHERS GUIDE

The Teacher's Guide is provided to you for each course your child(ren) is taking.

- For 5K there will be one Teacher's Guide and two student books which cover the year's study. Lesson series are divided into 4 quarters with a student evaluation at the conclusion of each lesson quarter.
- For 1st grade there will be two Teacher's Guides and ten Student LIFEPACS. Each Teacher's Guide will cover 5 units of study for a total of 10 units in the year's study.
- In 2nd 4th grade you will have one Teacher's Guide and the material in the Student LIFEPAC will increase in amount. There will be 10 units of study in the year's study.

The home-based teacher/parent will need to become familiar with the Teacher's Guide and the corresponding Student Life Pac. Your daily lesson material is a part of the Teacher's Guide.

The NFC Academy Teacher's Manual is not designed to replace the Teacher's Guide which comes with the curriculum, but to complement it. Very valuable and essential information is available to the homeschool parent/teacher in your Teacher's Guide. Important general information is available to the parents in the Teacher Notes and other areas.

•It is not necessary to complete weekly lesson plans as those have been given to you in the NFC Academy Lesson Planner.

SCHOOL YEAR

All students at NFC Academy when they begin their schoolwork are set-up with a school year of 180 school days based upon the date they start at NFC Academy. Following the NFC Academy Daily Lesson Planner (DLP) will help you stay on track for completion of your school year on schedule. Homeschool schedules at home are flexible but following the school year with your DLP will ensure compliance for any compulsory attendance requirements. If needed, parents may request an extension of the school year by notifying the school office. All schoolwork must be completed within a maximum of a calendar year.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Students in the book program must complete all daily assignments, self-tests, and unit tests. For Grades 1st-4th, the grades of self-tests, spelling tests (Language Arts), and unit tests are to be recorded in your Ignitia electronic gradebook weekly as completed. The

teacher issued grades for report and oral work is completed as each unit of study is completed.

LESSON PLANS

Your lesson plans are prepared in the NFC Academy Daily Lesson Planner. Following the DLP will ensure you will finish your program at the date you expect and give you assurance that each day's assignments fit within the master schedule.

Those in the book program may select virtual labs available on YouTube or other sites as long as they fit the general concepts being covered, or you may complete the live science experiment directly from the curriculum. We always recommend that safety precautions be a high priority for science experiments with materials that can present a danger when not handled correctly.

LIBRARY

All NFC Academy students in grades 3rd-12th have the Gale in Context Online Library, Britannica Online, plus an array of other online sites for research available for use. Students are given a password at the beginning of the year and may use these research tools anywhere they have Internet access. Gale is a comprehensive online library of books and research information allowing the student to create his/her own holdings of books for various projects.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

- Student attendance as typically defined will vary as a homeschool student, however, the work and requirements of the curriculum must be satisfied. Each student (K-12th) is assigned a 180-day school year when they start. Following the teacher actions will ensure that each student meets the clock hour/school day requirements to complete the school year as required in the 180-day school year.
- 2. Homeschool families do homeschool for several reasons and one of those reasons is the flexibility in scheduling and doing the work. Your special times should not affect the student meeting any compulsory attendance requirements if work is consistently being accomplished throughout the school year.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE AND ACADEMY HOLIDAY SCHEDULES

NFC Academy follows a "holiday" schedule as you might find in a traditional school as we believe that is essential for students to have breaks in their academic studies. Holidays are factored into the student's school year day count of 180-day year/90-day semester, both in

the online program and in the K-5th program using book-based material. Parents can be assured that they could take these holidays off if they chose and still be following their established school year which is set to meet compulsory attendance requirements that are often set by states.

GRADING SCALE

NFC academy follows the grading scale established by the State of Florida Department of Education for grades 1st-12th:

- 100 90 = A
- 89 80 = B
- 79 70 = C
- 69 60 = D
- Below 60 = F

GRADING PERIOD

Grading periods at NFC Academy follow a school term/semester period of time based upon the start date selected to begin schoolwork. Since start dates to begin can be any day of the school year a student's school term/year will follow their start date.

GRADES 1st-2nd BOOK PROGRAM

Grades are recorded in the Ignitia Electronic Gradebook for the book program weekly and will be automatically averaged by the gradebook using the following schedule:

Bible, History, Math, and Science

- 1. Self-Test 25%
- 2. LIFEPAC Test 60%
- 3. Report Grade 10%
- 4. Oral Grade 5%

Language Arts

- 1. Self-Tests 25%
- 2. LIFEPAC Tests 55%
- 3. Spelling Tests 10%
- 4. Oral/Report Grade 10%

BOOK PROGRAM 1st-2nd – GRADING INFORMATION

We have provided a video for training on entering your grades in the electronic gradebook. If you need assistance in completing the training, please contact the Academy Book Program Office and they can schedule an online conference with you to assist you in learning the process for entering your grades.

- 1. Electronic Gradebook Book Program grades will be similar to those in the Ignitia Online program as we have created your own electronic gradebook in Ignitia.
 - a. Parents will enter grades manually into the Ignitia gradebook. You and your student will be able to see a current average every day as you use the Ignitia grade book.
 - b. Grades should be entered in your gradebook each week as work is completed.
 - c. We will use the Ignitia gradebook, and the grades will be recorded to the student's report card in our RenWeb administrative software.
 - d. As an accredited school, when requested we must certify that a student is actively enrolled at NFC Academy to satisfy some state's compulsory attendance requirements. Entering grades at least weekly ensures that NFC Academy will be able to demonstrate, to those who may inquire, that a student is meeting compulsory attendance.
- 2. Grade Verification In grades 1st 4th parents and students can see the grades for all coursework in each subject in your electronic gradebook in the Ignitia Program.
 - a. Parents should enter grades in the electronic gradebook at least weekly for completed grade work.
 - b. The overall average will be reflected in the electronic gradebook.
 - c. Keep in mind that formal report card grades are completed each semester with units 1-5 for semester one and units 6-10 for semester two. The average in the electronic gradebook for first semester will show the average for those units, however the report card for the second semester only includes units 6-10 while the average in the gradebook continues to average all units together.
- 3. Sending Required Unit Test When each semester is completed and grades have been consistently entered in the gradebook program, unit tests from all subjects must be sent to the Academy as a matter of verification responsibilities for the Academy related to our accreditation requirements. Parents may mail the tests, scan then email, or upload copies using our website upload feature that will be provided to you. We recommend you always make copies of the tests for your records, before sending us the original tests.
 - a. For the first semester completed unit tests from student booklets 1-5 for all courses must be sent to the Academy.
 - b. These tests will allow us to meet our accreditation requirement of validating the student's academic work. Once received by the Academy our academic

office will complete the student's report card for the specific grading period, either first or second semester and make the report cards available to the parents. The report card grades will be a part of the student's permanent academic record. Please remember academic work requires these tests to finalize all grades. Final grades for a grading period cannot be authorized until the unit tests are received.

KINDERGARTEN REPORT GRADES

Kindergarten families will have their own electronic gradebook created by NFC Academy. We have downloadable grading sheets in your Kindergarten Teacher Resource section you can use to prepare your grades to enter into the electronic gradebook.

Parents will want to download your grading sheets on the NFC Academy website for Kindergarten Resources. These will guide you through creating the grades which you can then input into your online gradebook. E - Excellent, S+ Satisfactory plus, S - Satisfactory, S-- Satisfactory minus low, and NI - Needs Improvement

Kindergarten grades are entered at the end of each quarter's lesson series about every nine weeks:

- a. Lessons 1-40 first nine weeks
- b. Lessons 41-80 second nine weeks
- c. Lessons 81-120 third nine weeks
- d. Lessons 121-160 fourth nine weeks

MIDSEMESTER ACADEMIC REVIEW CONFERENCES

The K-7th grade Academic Office is responsible for conducting Academic Conference Reviews for all families with students in the Book Program at NFC Academy. These conferences are held twice per year—once following the first semester and again after the second semester—for each student enrolled full-time for the entire academic year. For students enrolled full-time for only one semester, a single conference is conducted annually. Conferences are scheduled after a student has been actively engaged in their studies for at least six weeks. Typically, first-semester conferences should be completed no later than December 1, while second-semester conferences should be finalized by April 15, however, exceptions are made for students who enroll later in the year, and in such cases, conferences may be conducted outside these standard timeframes.

The procedure for completing a conference would be as follows:

- 1. Use the specific pre-written email in the OMS to complete the process for the Academic Conference.
- 2. Using RenWeb select each grade level for your grades and run a list of students for the conferences.
- From the group create an Excel file as your master file from the example file provided. This file should be uploaded to TEAMS in a folder that will be created.
 Your file should be labeled for the grade levels covered.
- 4. Complete the basic review and note the grades of each course and the approximate amount of the course completed. Remember second semester grades must be averaged manually using units 6-10 or if exams are included could be 7-12 or some combination.
- 5. Send the OMS email to the family noting you are available for a phone conference for any questions or video conference, and they will contact you to schedule.
- 6. A copy of the report is placed in the student's folder. These, like other files for the monthly academic report, is evidence of our work with students and parents. These files are not forwarded to other schools, but just for the benefit of NFC Academy and its contact with families. They will be preserved for records related to accreditation review.

STUDENT ACADEMIC REPORT

As a part of our commitment to work as partners with the homeschool family, NFC Academy completes a formal Academic Report monthly. The intent of this report is for notification purposes to the family of several areas:

- Students doing work above the normal expected pace (16% and up) in a specific course will be sent notification to the parent. This is intended to recognize the hard work of the student during this period in their subjects.
- Students will be notified when work is on target (11% 15.9%) for what is expected to be completed during the reporting period.
- Students will be notified when work is slightly below (6% 10.9%) what is expected during the reporting period.
- When students work during a reporting period is inadequate (0.1-5.9%), which is approximately four (4) weeks, the parents will be notified. A student who does not complete work in a specific subject during a report period falls in jeopardy of not completing their coursework by their school year end date. Please note our policies for extension of work beyond the standard school year of 180 days is on our website under Tuition Policies. The maximum extension for a student to complete their work is up to one calendar year.
- When students work during a reporting period is considered a failure to progress (0%), which is approximately four (4) weeks, the parents will be

notified. A student who does not complete work in a specific subject during a report period falls in jeopardy of not completing their coursework by their school year end date.

- If a student's overall average falls below a -70- the parent will be notified with our monthly report.
- Students whose work continues to be inadequate over a period of reports may require the NFC Academic Office to review and bring the matter officially to the parent's attention trying to find a remedy to engage the student in their work.

FAILURE TO PROGRESS PROCEDURE

As a result of the Academic report, if a student is found to have made no (0%) academic progress for that period of time that student will begin to have more focused follow up in an effort to get that student working. The following procedure will be followed as part of the Failure to Progress procedure:

Week 1:

- Action: Send the Failure to Progress Report to parents simultaneously with the teachers' reports.
- Response Time: Allow parents 3 days to respond to the email.

Week 2:

- Action: Follow up with phone calls to parents about the reports that was sent in the previous week. This ensures that parents are aware of the report and can address any concerns promptly.
- Response Time: Allow parents 3 days to respond to phone call.

Week 3:

- Action: Send list of students who have not been actively working in the program or whose school term has ended to Cori and Becky for a follow-up call and email.
- Response time: Allow 3 days for the parent to respond to the attempt to contact.
- Action: Send the Failure to Progress Report, including the percentage of work completed during the week and the expected work percentage for the upcoming week. This provides a clear benchmark for both students and parents to track progress.
- Response time: Allow 3 days for the parent to respond to the attempt to contact.
- Action: Continue following up with phone calls to parents who haven't responded about the Failure to Progress report that was sent. This ensures that parents are aware of the report and can address any concerns promptly.

Week 4:

- Action: Send an updated Failure to Progress Report detailing the work completed during the week. This report should follow the same format as the previous one and give an up-to-date account of the student's progress.
- Response Time: Allow 3 days for the parent to respond to the attempt to the email
- Action: Continue following up with phone calls to parents who haven't responded about the Failure to Progress report that was sent. This ensures that parents are aware of the report and can address any concerns promptly.
- Action: Disable students Ignitia access.
- Response Time: Allow 3 days for the parent to respond to the disabling of Ignitia access

Week 5:

- Action: Send a list of students who need further follow up to Cori/Becky for a follow up call and email.
- Response time: Allow 3 days for the parent to respond to that attempt to contact.
- Action: Send the Report Card email explaining that the student will be withdrawn from school for failure to comply with the attendance policy.
- Response time: Allow parents 3 days to respond to the email.
- Action: Continue following up with phone calls to parents who haven't responded about the Inadequate and Failure to progress report that was sent. This ensures that parents are aware of the report and can address any concerns promptly.

Week 6:

- Action: Send 5-day withdrawal email if no response from any previous attempt to contact.
- Response Time: Give 5 days to respond to withdrawal email. If no response, then move to withdrawal from the Academy.

Week 7:

• Action: Withdrawal process is started for those who have not responded to emails and phone calls from the Academy. All grades will be recorded as "F" on the official report card due to the lack of academic progress.

STANDARDIZED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS

- In the spring of the year, you will receive information from the Academy regarding administering the test.
- The Academy uses the Stanford 10th Edition Achievement test which is a norm referenced national achievement test.

- For Grades K-2, complete instruction on administering the tests will be provided to you with the test materials.
- For Grades K-2, completed tests will be returned to the Academy and the test will be scored electronically by the publisher, Pearson.
- For Grades 3-4, all testing will be conducted online. All relevant information will be provided to families in advance.

You will receive a copy of the results from the Academy.
