

Phonics - Review Vowels and Consonants

We use words every day! We use words when we talk, write, and read. You will study phonics in your second grade lessons.

Do you remember what makes a word? Words are made of letters. There are twenty-six letters in our alphabet. When these letters are put together in special ways, they make words.

Let's review the letters of the alphabet.

The letters *a*, *e*, *i*, *o*, and *u* are **vowels**.


The letters that are not vowels are called **consonants**.
